**Sacramento Superior Court Deploys New Case Management System**  
**Effective April 24, 2023**

Sacramento Superior Court will deploy a new case management system, eCourt, on Monday, April 24, 2023 for the following case types: Civil, Mental Health, Probate, and Civil Harassment Restraining Orders. eCourt is a product of Journal Technologies Inc., and is currently in operation in many other California Superior Courts. Following deployment, the public can expect to view and download documents through the Court's website and the Court will work towards implementing eFiling for eCourt case types.

**What This Means for Civil Users in Sacramento County**

**Friday April 21, 2023 through Friday, April 28, 2023:**

- All Civil front counters at the Gordon D. Schaber Courthouse and the Hall of Justice will be **closed to in-person assistance**.
- Parties or attorney's filing documents or requesting copies will be directed to the drop box. Documents will be file stamped with the drop box date and processed in the order they were received.
- Hearings will go forward as scheduled in the courtroom. During this time of implementation there could be issues or delays that affect the court's ability to handle all matters set for hearing.
- The Court will continue to process Civil Harassment Restraining Orders. All parties can receive assistance with filing at the Gordon D. Schaber Courthouse, Room 102, Window 18.

Civil Self-Help Services will continue to offer assistance to self-represented litigants at the Hall of Justice located at 813 6<sup>th</sup> Street, Room 117.

## What This Means for Probate Users in Sacramento County

### On Friday April 21 through Wednesday, April 26, 2023:

- Probate front counters will be **closed to in-person assistance**.
- Parties or attorney's filing documents or requesting copies will be directed to the drop box. Documents will be file stamped with the drop box date and processed in the order they were received.
- Kiosks will not be functional in the lobby.
- Hearings will go forward as scheduled in the courtroom. During this time of implementation there could be issues or delays that affect the court's ability to handle all matters set for hearing.
- Access to the Public Case Access System (PCAS) will be available to the public and Court users.
- Probate Notes will not be posted or updated between noon on Friday, April 21 through Sunday, April 23, 2023.

PCAS subscriptions will be migrated to eCourt and those with subscriptions will continue to receive notification when documents are posted to cases via email.

It's always a challenge to implement a new case management system, so we ask for your patience during the first few weeks. Additional information will be available on the Court's internet site following deployment.
