ORDER: DESTRUCTION OF TRIAL  
COURT EXHIBITS

**BY ORDER OF THE COURT AND EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY**, pursuant to section 1952 of the Code of Civil Procedure the trial court clerk is authorized to destroy trial court exhibits and depositions in a civil action or proceeding 60 days after final determination or dismissal of the action or proceeding, or final determination on appeal, after the clerk provides written notice to the parties by first-class mail of intent to dispose of exhibits. The trial court clerk is authorized to destroy post trial hearing exhibits or depositions in a civil action 60 days after the conclusion of the hearing, or if an appeal is taken, upon final determination of the appeal, after the clerk provides written notice to the parties by first-class mail of intent to dispose of exhibits.

This order shall remain in effect until such time as it may be modified or revoked.
