

## SUPERIOR COURT OF CALIFORNIA, COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO PROPOSITION 36 Health and Safety Code 11395 CONDITIONS OF O.R. RELEASE

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A complaint having been filed in this court charging the above-named defendant with a violation(s) contained within section 11395 of the Health & Safety Code (Treatment-Mandated Felony), the court having conducted a hearing, and the defendant having entered a plea of guilty or no contest and deferred from judgment on the charge(s) now filed in this court for the period specified by the Court; and during this time shall be released on the defendant's own recognizance with the following conditions:

- 1. Defendant participate in a drug and alcohol rehabilitation program under the direction of the probation officer, to include chemical testing of the blood, breath or urine as directed by the probation officer.
- 2. Defendant not knowingly own or possess any dangerous or deadly weapon.
- 3. Defendant shall submit their person, property and automobile and any object under defendant's control to search and seizure in or out of the presence of the defendant, by any law enforcement officer and/or probation officer, at any time of the day or night, with or without their consent, with or without a warrant. Defendant being advised of their constitutional rights in this regard, and having accepted deferred entry of judgment, is deemed to have waived same.
- 4. Defendant shall seek and obtain professional counseling and/or treatment at the direction of the probation officer.
- 5. Defendant shall not knowingly use, handle or possess controlled substances, to include marijuana, unless lawfully prescribed to the defendant by a licensed medical practitioner.
- 6. Defendant shall not associate with persons they know to be illegal users or sellers of marijuana, controlled substances or narcotics, nor be in places where defendant knows illegal narcotics and/or controlled substances are present.
- 7. Defendant shall abstain from the consumption of any alcoholic beverage in any amount whatsoever and shall not possess alcohol, nor be in places where defendant knows alcohol is the chief items of sale.
- 8. Defendant shall not drive a vehicle with any measurable amount of alcohol in their blood.
- 9. The defendant shall not knowingly own, purchase, receive, possess or have under their custody or control, any firearm, ammunition, reloaded ammunition or ammunition feeding device, including any magazine. The defendant shall not knowingly purchase, own or possess any body armor. Conditions as mandated in PC 29800(a)(1), 29810(a)(2), 30305(a) and 31360.
- 10. Defendant shall participate in an evidence-based outpatient drug/alcohol intervention program under the direction of the probation officer, to include chemical testing of the blood, breath, saliva or urine as directed by the probation officer.
- 11. Upon any release from custody, defendant shall report to probation within two working days.
- 12. Defendant shall participate in chemical testing of the blood, breath, urine and saliva as directed by the probation officer.
- 13. Obey all laws applicable to you.
- 14. Seek and/or maintain regular and steady employment or be enrolled in an educational or vocational program approved by the probation officer having your supervision; not voluntarily change employment without providing prior notification to your probation officer; and if your employment is terminated, either temporarily or permanently, for any cause whatsoever, you are to notify your probation officer within 48 hours.
- 15. You may not leave the State of California, at any time, without first securing permission from your probation officer and completing the appropriate procedures to do so. You are not to remain away from your regular residence for more than 48 hours without first having secured permission from your probation officer. You are to immediately notify your probation officer of any intended change of address and the reasons therefore.
- 16. Defendant shall follow in all respects any reasonable instructions given to them by the probation officer.
- 17. You shall allow probation officers to visit your home and place of employment at reasonable times.
- 18. Inform your probation officer of dogs and other pets with potential to cause harm in the residence/notify of changes within 24 hours.

I agree to abide by the conditions ordered above and I will comply as ordered. I agree to report to the Probation Department as directed.
