ORDER

EXTENSION OF COURT CLOSURE ORDER – April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020

and

IMPLEMENTATION OF RENEWED EMERGENCY RELIEF

(Cal. Gov. Code §68115)

The court’s prior Temporary Court Closure Order issued March 19, 2020, and all subsequent amendments thereto, are hereby extended in full force and effect from April 17, 2020 to and including May 15, 2020.

The period April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, is declared a court holiday for all purposes, except for the limited emergency matters enumerated in the court’s Temporary Court Closure Order issued March 19, 2020, and all subsequent amendments thereto. All courthouses and courtrooms remain closed for judicial business, except as required to process and adjudicate those limited emergency matters excepted from the continuing court holiday.

Further, pursuant to the authority provided under California Government Code Section 68115, the court hereby implements the renewed emergency relief granted in the April 16, 2020 order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California,

1 **IT IS ORDERED:**

2 1. April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, are deemed holidays for purposes of
3 computing time for filing papers with the court under Code of Civil Procedure Sections 12 and
4 12(a).

5 2. Pursuant to the authority granted under section 68115 of the Government Code,
6 the court extends the following deadlines for the period April 17, 2020, to May 15, 2020,
7 inclusive:

8 a. The duration of any temporary restraining order that would otherwise expire
9 because the emergency conditions prevent the court from conducting proceedings to determine
10 whether the permanent order should be entered is extended by **30** days. This applies only to cases
11 in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 17, 2020, to May 15, 2020,
12 inclusive. This relief is in addition to, and is intended to supplement, the relief provided by the
13 Judicial Council in Emergency Rules of Court, rule 8(a) and (b).

14 b. The court extends the time periods provided in section 313 of the Welfare and
15 Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must
16 be released from custody to not more than seven days. This relief applies only to minors for
17 whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 16, 2020, to May 15, 2020,
18 inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11))

19 c. The court extends the time periods provided in section 315 of the Welfare and
20 Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must
21 be given a detention hearing to not more than seven days. This relief applies only to minors for
22 whom the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 16, 2020, to May 15, 2020,
23 inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

24 d. The court extends the time periods provided in sections 632 and 637 of the
25 Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending wardship
26 proceedings and charged with a felony offense must be given a detention hearing or rehearing to
27 not more than seven days. This relief applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline
28 otherwise would expire from April 16, 2020, to May 15, 2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, §

1 68115(a)(11));

2 e. The court extends the time period provided in section 334 of the Welfare and
3 Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile dependency petition must be held by not
4 more than 15 days. This relief applies only to minors for whom the statutory deadline otherwise
5 would expire on from April 16, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12));
6 and,

7 f. The court extends the time period provided in section 657 of the Welfare and
8 Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition for a minor charged with a felony
9 offense must be held by not more than 15 days. This relief applies only to minors for whom the
10 statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 16, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive. (Gov.
11 Code, § 68115(a)(12))

12 3. The court declares that from April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, is deemed
13 a holiday/holidays for purposes of computing time under Code of Civil Procedure 1167 (five-day
14 period within which defendant must respond to a complaint in unlawful detainer action).

15 4. The court declares that from April 17, 2020 to May 15, 2020, inclusive, is deemed
16 a holiday/holidays for purposes of computing the time under Code of Civil Procedure 116.330(a)
17 (requires a small claims matter to be scheduled for hearing no earlier than 20 days but not more
18 than 70 days from the date of the order directing the parties to appear at the hearing).

19 **THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY AND WILL REMAIN IN**
20 **EFFECT UNTIL MAY 15, 2020. THIS ORDER MAY BE AMENDED AS**
21 **CIRCUMSTANCES REQUIRE.**
