

**ORDER**  
**IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF**  
(Cal. Gov. Code §68115)


Pursuant to the authority granted by order of the Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court as Chairperson of the Judicial Council dated October 14, 2020, and upon the grounds specified in California Government Code section 68115,

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED,**

1. This Court may hold sessions anywhere in the county, including in correctional and juvenile detention facilities, from October 23, 2020, to November 21, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(1));
2. The Court extends the time period provided in section 825 of the Penal Code within which a defendant charged with a felony offense must be taken before a magistrate from 48 hours to not more than 7 days, applicable only to cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from October 13, 2020 to November 11, 2020, inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(8));
3. The Court extends the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than an additional 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the original or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from

1 October 22, 2020 through November 25, 2020, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10); Executive  
2 Order N-38-20 (03-27-20))<sup>1</sup>

25 <sup>1</sup> This authority supplements the authority to extend Penal Code section 1382 deadlines previously granted in the  
26 March 23, March 30, and April 29, 2020 statewide emergency orders and in the May 14, July 15, August 17, and  
27 September 15, 2020, emergency orders specific to the Court. Accordingly, for any case in which the time to bring a  
28 defendant to trial previously was extended under one or more of those prior emergency orders, and the extended  
deadline falls within the above-specified time period, the Chief Justice's Order authorizes this Court to extend the  
previously extended deadline by up to an additional 30 days. For any case in which the initial Penal Code section  
1382 deadline falls within the above-specified time period and is not governed by a prior emergency order, the Chief  
Justice's Order authorizes this Court to extend the time to bring a defendant to trial by a total of up to 30 days.
