
JUROR PARKING INFORMATION

Free parking is available in the **St. Joseph's Jury Lot** (located between F & G and 8th & 9th Streets) and **Lot 297** (located at 7th and F Streets) for reporting jurors. Please display your current jury parking permit on your dashboard.



Please note: Juror parking permits are valid Monday through Friday until 5:00 p.m. Parking in the designated juror lots after 5:00 p.m. will be at the juror's own expense.

WHERE JURORS CAN PARK

St. Joseph's Jury Lot at 8TH & G Streets and Lot 297 at 7th and F Streets- These are the two designated <u>free</u> parking lots for reporting jurors. You must display a current jury parking permit (located at the top of the summons) on your dashboard. If you need a current parking permit, please see jury staff in the Jury Assembly Room.

Overflow parking is available at the County Public Parking Lot (2-Story Lot) located at 7th and G Streets. This lot is ONLY available when both designated jury parking lots are <u>full</u>. You must present your parking ticket to the Jury Assembly Room staff for validation prior to exiting the parking lot.

WHERE JURORS SHOULD NOT PARK

Any lot other than the **St. Joseph's Jury Lot at 8TH & G Streets and Lot 297 at 7th and F Streets.**Parking in the **County Public Parking Lot (2-Story Lot)** located at 7th and G Streets is only permitted if the designated jury parking lots are full.

Parking Meters - Jurors should never park at a meter as the court cannot "recall" or "take care" of parking tickets for expired meters. For those jurors that have a disabled placard and/or license plate meter parking is available on a first come, first served basis.

Parking Lots Other Than The Designated Lots - Jurors parking in lots other than designated lots above will be charged as there is no agreement with other private or public lots to provide juror parking.

Self-Parking Lots - Some local lots are "self-parking lots" where you pay for a ticket at a machine and put it on your dashboard. Placing the jury parking permit on the vehicle dashboard is <u>not</u> valid as these lots do not have an agreement to allow jurors to park there for free. If you fail to purchase a ticket you will be cited and the jury staff cannot "recall" or "take care" of that citation.
